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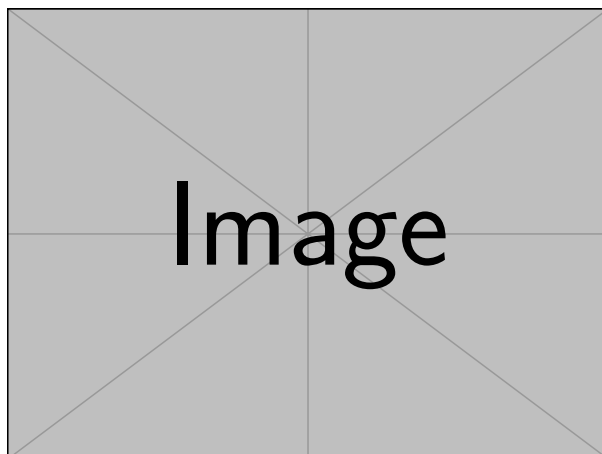
**Sample Heading (Third Level).** Only two levels of headings should be numbered. Lower-level headings remain unnumbered; they are formatted as run-in headings.

1 <sup>st</sup> -level heading	<b>1 Title.level.1</b>	12 <i>point</i> , bold
2 <sup>nd</sup> -level heading	<b>1.1 Title.level.2</b>	10 <i>point</i> , bold
3 <sup>rd</sup> -level heading	<b>Title.level.3.</b> Text follows	10 <i>point</i> , bold
4 <sup>th</sup> -level heading	<i>Title.level.4.</i> Text follows	10 <i>point</i> , italic
